

2SLGBTQIA+ Patients Can Face Challenges in Their Cancer Care

The challenges may include:

- Less access to screening and prevention services
- Past experiences with discrimination in healthcare settings
- Receiving care from providers that may not understand how important being part of the 2SLGBTQIA+ community is for you
- Lack of support groups and information that make you and the people who support you, feel welcome and included
- Being cared for healthcare providers who may not understand or know how to address their needs

Pronouns

The Princess Margaret Cancer Centre is working to provide care that inclusive to all of our diverse patients.

Many staff wear a pronoun button or rainbow lanyard to show support to our 2SLGBTQIA+ patient communities.

Staff don't know a person's pronouns by their name or how they look. Staff often introduce themselves by sharing their name and pronouns. You can share your pronouns as well so that staff refer to you correctly.



The Princess Margaret Welcomes Your Chosen Family

At the Princess Margaret, the people in your life who support you are valued. Your healthcare teams understand the important role your loved ones have in helping with your care.

The people who support you, your family or chosen family are welcome, included and involved in your care at the Princess Margaret.

They may be a member of your chosen or biological family.

Your chosen family can:

- Help you feeling less isolated or alone
- Listen to you talk about feelings and concerns
- Help to reduce stress, depression, and anxiety
- Help you bring up questions and concerns for your medical team




